HESSLE WEST OPEN GARDENS 2024 – Our 30th Anniversary –

This year's Hessle West Open Gardens will be our 30th year of raising funds for local charities and we are hoping that, with your help, it will be our best ever! Since our very first event, a fantastic £130,000 has been raised and donated to local charities so please help us get to \pounds 150,000 by coming along on Sunday 19thMay, from 11am to 5pm.

We are delighted to welcome several new gardens joining us for the first time as well as others returning after a break. As far as humanly possible, sunny weather is guaranteed as you stroll around up to 20 beautiful gardens on Davenport Avenue, Southfield, Woodfield Lane, Ferriby Road, Dunstan Drive, South Lane, Barrow Lane and Boothferry Road.

All participating gardens will have balloons and posters outside their property and to get your ticket, simply go into any of the gardens between 11am and 5pm on 19th May and make your purchase. It costs £5.00 per adult and children are free. The ticket takes the form of a map so you can clearly see which gardens are open and plan your preferred route.We are grateful to the Hessle Community Centre who provide a free minibus service on a loop around the participating area and the Hessle Scout Leaders who drive it - simply hop on and off!

Some gardens also offer refreshments at very reasonable prices including tea, coffee, soft drinks, cakes, biscuits, ice creams, and BBQ so you can really make a full day of it. Visitors are also welcome to bring their own packed lunch and sit and eat it in their favourite garden.

Some gardens will have plants for sale too, all home grown with many ready to be potted out. Others offer activities for younger visitors such as a train ride and treasure hunt.

Please note this is a cash only event.

All money raised on the day is donated to local charities including Dove House Hospice, so you not only have a great day out but also contribute to some wonderful and very worthy local causes. Our donation to the Tranby Gate Woodland and Wildlife Haven on the corner of Ferriby Road and Heads Lane last year should be visible to all who pass it and raise a smile as they used the money to plant nearly 1000 spring bulbs!

We hope to see as many of you as possible on the day and would be grateful if readers would spread the word to friends and family and help us raise the profile of this wonderful community event in this, our 30th year.

Supporting Local Causes

Organised and hosted by the Hesslewood Charitable Causes Fund, in association with East Yorkshire Thoroughbred Car Club, this event unites the community in passion and altruism. HCCF takes pride in having supported over 20 local causes, charities, and volunteer-led facilities, having raised over £140,000 in the last decade.

This year's event aims to continue this legacy by supporting North Ferriby Riding for The Disabled. This self-funded, volunteer-led charity serves as a therapy centre, providing individuals of all ages and disabilities with opportunities to interact with horses and ponies.

The centre would benefit greatly by being able to offer year-round riding and lessons. A roof over the arena would allow the charity to offer much more consistency, benefiting the community, the families and the charity volunteers. The project is very much a collaborative effort, with HCCF and other local business being heavily involved in the planning and construction of the project, donating funds, and volunteering labour, materials, and expertise.

If you live or work in or around Hessle, you might be familiar with the Hesslewood Office Park signage that proudly

stands at the entrance to the estate. This development of grade 2 listed and newly built offices is set within 10 acres of landscaped parkland.

- Councillor Viv Padden -

Councillor Viv Padden sadly passed away on the 3rd December – the Town Council wanted to give Viv the memorial he deserved by waiting until this issue of the newsletter to remember his life and service to the community in which he lived.

Viv was a well loved and respected member of the local community, working tirelessly for everyone. He had a 'can do' attitude about life. He had a heart of gold and would do anything for anyone in need. He was solid, dependable, reliable and had old school values about life.

Viv was first elected to Hessle Town council in 2018 through a byelection, he stood again and was re-elected in 2019 and 2023. Not content with just the Town Council, Viv was also elected Ward member for Tranby in 2019 and 2023.

Viv served on the following committees at the Hessle Town Council Planning & Traffic, Environment & Open Spaces, Events & Communications (Chair), Finance, Asset and Personnel. Volunteering for events and activities outside of these meetings. During the lockdown he volunteered for the Hessle and Anlaby food bank and continued to support this after lockdown with his daily visits to Morrisons and Sainsburys picking up donations, he then forwarded donations onto other local charities/sports and Church groups. He hated to see food go to waste and would transport donations to wherever needed.

He was a trustee of the Haltemprice skate park.

He was on the ERNLLCA executive committee and was involved in the local branch of the Royal British Legion and the Anlaby Men in sheds.

Viv served in the Royal Navy for many years, rising up through the ranks to be a Petty Officer. He was then employed for some years by BP on the oil rigs as a Helicopter landing officer.

He met Jackie his partner, 31 years ago and went onto run a bed and breakfast followed by a fish and chip shop in Huddersfield. He retired, got bored and then went on to run another fish and chip shop with Jackie in Boulevard, Hull for something to do.

In his younger days Viv ran the London marathon 3 times, the New York Marathon, the Dublin marathon and the Great North run.

Every Sunday he would find a 10K, marathon or a half marathon somewhere, he just loved running. He hated it when his knees couldn't take it anymore.

Viv was extremely enthusiastic about life, kind and generous to everyone, He will be greatly missed by his family, friends and colleagues.

One of Viv's last jobs was delivering the biggest bag of daffodil bulbs to Cllr Hogan's house – all have been planted and known affectionately as 'Viv's Bed'.







A NEW MEMORIAL HAS BEEN INSTALLED IN TOWER HILL MEMORIAL PARK

It has been funded by Hessle Town Council, in commemoration of all the local people who have made the ultimate sacrifice for their town and country.

Simon Pickering, councillor for both Hessle Town and East Riding of Yorkshire Councils, said: "Councillors have worked with our local branch of the British Legion to develop this new memorial, which is only fitting given the democracy we enjoy today was secured for us and future generations by those who fell fighting against dictatorship and oppression."

Newly elected Hessle Town Councillor Steve Craggs; "This is the exact sort of thing Councillors want to do for Hessle. It's a pleasure working with people from the community, like Ian Dean and his colleagues at the British Legion, to make something like this become a reality."



Councillor Pickering added: "We are local Councillors, who live in the Hessle community. Remembering those brave members of the armed forces who came from our town is important to us. This memorial ensures their sacrifice is never forgotten."

A commemorative plaque is also to be installed in the park, in memory of the late Councillor Viv Padden, who did so much to secure this memorial.

MAYORS CIVIC SERVICE

The Mayors Civic Service took place on Sunday 11th February at All Saints Church. Civic dignitaries from local Town & Parish Councils in the area were invited and the Chairman of East Riding of Yorkshire Council, Councillor John Whittle also attended as well as Mr Andrew Horncastle MBE, DL, Deputy Lieutenant of The East Riding of Yorkshire. Members of the local voluntary community were also invited.

This year the Mayor, Councillor John Bovill, chose two organisations, the mental health charity MIND and the local charity Humber Rescue to be the beneficiaries of the raffle and auction. In total over £600 was raised, to be split between these two organisations. The Mayor commented "I cannot



thank enough all the local businesses and individuals who donated prizes and money to the Civic Appeal. The generosity of the Hessle business community was heart-warming and all those I spoke to were only too willing to donate. These people help to make Hessle the special place that it is."


