What's happening in Your Area & Community Priorities?

Humber-talking has set our priorities, this month we are to:

- 1. Burglaries
- 2. Anti-Social Behaviour
- 3. Scams and Crime Prevention

Here's a summary of **just some of the crimes** that have been reported across all three Wards last month:



Residential Burglary reports (eight reports across Hessle Ward last month)

1/4/24 - Southfield, property has been broken via lock snapping the side door whilst occupants are away, car key and car stolen from the driveway.

5/4/24 – Sunningdale Road, Hanoi burglary after entry gained to property via the rear doors after burning the locks causing them to snap, once inside car keys stolen, along with vehicle – Audi which is later found and recovered by Police. Enquiries ongoing.

12/4/24 – Bon Accord Road, Hanoi burglary after suspects have gained entry via a rear PVC kitchen door, lock snapped, once inside conduct untidy search through drawers, stealing car keys and wallet which contained cash before making off with victim's vehicle. Enquiries are ongoing.

16/4/24 – The Circle, Hanoi burglary with a similar MO as above-mentioned burglaries, rear door lock snapped, and car keys stolen along with vehicle. Enquiries ongoing.

16/424 – The Norland, male suspect has entered the kitchen pub where he takes a set of keys to the walk-in fridge and enters before been disturbed by the Chef. Following extensive enquiries, suspect is arrested for offences relating to 2 x Burglary and theft of motor vehicle. Enquiries are ongoing.

20/4/24 - Bedford Road, attempt entry to property via the rear door with negative results.

23/4/24 – Cambridge Road, Hanoi burglary, suspects enter property stealing handbag and car keys belonging to the victim before taking vehicle which was later located. Named suspect and enquiries continue.



24/4/24 – Hull Road, suspect approaches victim's garage/workshop which is in the garden and causes damage to the lock to try and gain entry with negative results.

Business Burglary reports (no new reports)

Thefts (nine reports across all Wards last month)

1/4/24 – Hull Road, theft from vehicle, handbag, and contents

8/4/24 – Barnetby Road, theft from shed, two push bikes stolen from within.

9/4/24 – Total Filling Station, shop theft

10/4/24 – Melton Old Road, theft of high value vehicle from driveway, enquiries ongoing with significant leads to possible offenders.

10/4/24 – Park Road, Welton, theft of metal, unknown suspects enter victims garden and taken metal items and load them onto a vehicle before driving off without permission of the victim.

12/4/24 – Sainsburys, shop theft of multiple bottles of alcohol, adult male arrested and charged for the offence.

15/4/24 – Timberland Sheds, theft from vehicle, suspect has entered vehicle by unknown method, and opened the glove box taking out an envelope that contained a large sum of cash before making off.

16/4/24 - Canon Tardrew Court, two unknown suspects have attempted to steal victims' motorbike which was outside the address, bike alarm has gone off startling the suspects as



they have used bolt cutters to cut the lock on the front wheel of the bike causing the suspects to make off empty handed.

29/4/24 – Elloughton News, shop theft, suspect named, and enquiries continue.

Damage (three report across all Wards)

20/4/24 - South Cave, damage caused to victims' vehicle as it was parked on the road, passenger side damaged.

23/4/24 - Cambridge Road, criminal damage caused to garden gate.

25/4/24 - Southfield Drive, criminal damage caused to street bench.

Drugs (no new reports)

Other (over forty other investigations across all Wards) These include public order, stalking, harassment, assault, and malicious communications to name just a few, along with domestic related incidents, some of which are still ongoing.



Humber-talking has set our priorities, this month we are to:

- 1. Burglaries in the Hessle area. March saw an increase in burglaries including reports of three shed and one garage burglary and most recent attempts made to open car and front door of a dwelling. High visibility patrols will be carried out in Hessle and cross border areas to identify offenders and prevent further offences. Humber talking will be carried out by NPT when offences are reported and this in turn helps promote security improvements, intel gather and ask for residents to remain vigilant and report any suspicious activity.
- 2. Anti-Social Behaviour Hessle Square and surrounding area. Since the beginning of the year, we have seen an increase in reports of anti-social behaviour in Hessle Square and surrounding area. Throughout the coming weeks patrols will continue to show high visibility presence within the problem areas. Anti-social behaviour talks will be rolled out at Hessle High School to highlight the issues, offences, and implications of this kind of behaviour.
- 3. If you feel that you have been scammed and would like to speak to someone face to face, please come into your local police station for a confidential chat. It is highly likely that it will be a known scam and you will not be alone. If your local police station is closed or you are unable to get there promptly, please do not delay. Call Action Fraud or Humberside police on the numbers below for advice.
