What's happening in Your Area & Community Priorities?

Humber-talking has set our priorities, this month we are to:

- 1. Reduce Burglaries ongoing.
- 2. Anti-Social Behaviour Hessle Square and surrounding areas.
 - 3. Welton Waters update



Here's a summary of **just some of the crimes** that have been reported across all three Wards last month:

Residential Burglary reports (several reports made)

6/7/24 Park Avenue, attempt residential burglary to property after torches were seen by neighbour after failed attempts to enter rear of property and flee location before police arrival.

6/7/24 Wood view domestic related residential burglary after known suspect enters property and takes personal items belonging to victim.

8/7/24 Bellway Homes, Blenheim Avenue, residential burglary after suspect approaches compound, breaks lock by unknown means and gains entry to site and steals items from within. Suspect the approaches property within site and gains entry by unknown means and smashes boiler from wall and exits property. Suspect then approaches another property and gains entry via the garage, conducts search, nothing stolen and egress as per entry.

11/7/24 Tranby Avenue, residential burglary to property after unknown suspect kicks the front door open and once inside steal work tools before exiting as per entry.

18/7/24 Glamis Road Hanoi burglary to property after suspect enters house through a window, take car keys, house keys and mobile phone before stealing the victim's vehicle from the drive. Enquiries still ongoing.

18/7/24 Beverley Road, attempt residential burglary to property after two unknown male suspects enter garden via the back edge carrying 2 x satchels and a locking wheel nut tool and 2 chisels, they make off from location leaving behind tools possibly due to being spooked by our officers in the area. Enquiries still ongoing.

26/7/24 New Walk, Hanoi burglary to property after suspects gain entry to victims semidetached property and gain entry via the conservatory door by means not known, once inside remove handbag containing car keys, purse, and passport before using the car keys to steal



victim's car located on the drive. Following extensive enquiries four persons of interest have been identified and enquiries ongoing.

Business Burglary reports (three new reports)

18/7/24 Hull Road, burglary to Angling Shop after 2 unknown suspects break into the side entrance of business premise and steal a large quantity of fishing equipment along with £100 from the till before making off in a vehicle with the stolen goods. Enquiries ongoing.

26/7/24 Ferriby High Road, burglary to business premise after unknown suspects rip wooden panel off and enter building causing damage inside and exiting as per entry.

29/7/24 Wastege Waste Management Ltd, Gibson Lane, business burglary to premises after 2 unknown males attend business yard in a car and break the lock off the gate before entering yard and looking around before leaving again. Suspects return later in a different vehicle and make multiple trips back and forth stealing approx. £100,000 worth of tools and equipment. Suspect identified and enquiries ongoing.

Thefts (eight reports made)

1/7/24 Heron Foods, Hessle shop theft, suspect named and enquiries ongoing.

8/7/24 Tesco, Boothferry Road, theft of wallet and contents.

10/7/24 Rosner Drive, theft from garden, shrubs

10/7/24 Sewell, Petuaria Way, make off without payment of fuel.

12/7/24 Cave Road, Brough, theft of parcel from Royal Mail

16/7/24 Westbourne Grove, theft from vehicle, loose change and a torch is stolen from within but negative entry to the rear of the van.



22/7/24 Walkington Road, theft of vehicle and personal items from within. Suspects identified and enquiries ongoing.

26/7/24 Boothferry Road, theft from person after victim has withdrawn £120 from cash machine and when putting money away suspect has asked for a lighter before grabbing the money and running off. Suspect arrested and bailed with enquiries still ongoing.

Damage (five reports made)

5/7/24 Ferriby Road, criminal damage caused to Hub carpark after a group of 5 or 6 male youths enter the toilet and cause damage to toilet roll dispensers, smashing them off the wall.

11/7/24 Tranby Avenue, criminal damage caused to vehicle after all four tyres are slashed.

11/7/24 The Buccaneer, criminal damage caused to motorcycle – scratches to paint work after owner refused to move it causing to move said motorcycle recklessly causing the damage in the process.

25/7/24 Eastgate, domestic related criminal damage caused to vehicle, large scratch caused, named suspect and enquiries ongoing.

29/7/24 Aire Close, criminal damage caused to front door and fencing, suspect named and enquiries ongoing.

Drugs (one report made)

8/7/24 Hull Mitsubishi Centre Ltd, cannabis seized from bag belonging to female suspect when conducting section 23 search of vehicle. Enquiries ongoing.



Other (over several other investigations across all Wards) These include public order, stalking, harassment, assault, and malicious communications to name just a few, along with domestic related incidents and blackmail, some of which are still ongoing.

Humber-talking has set our priorities, this month we are to:

1. Reduce Burglaries – Hanois and sheds.

Whilst Hanoi burglaries (whereby suspect enters a property and steal car keys and car) appear less prevalent within the Hessle Ward area. There has been an increasing amount of 'suspicious circumstances' logs and attempt burglaries to sheds/dwellings. This has been particularly around the Hull Road area of Hessle. Throughout the coming months there will be hotspot patrolling around the above aforementioned problem areas.

2. Anti-Social Behaviour – All Wards

Anti-Social-Behaviour continues to be high up on our list of priorities and we have been working in conjunction with Hull West Neighbourhoods to disrupt the Boothferry Estate, along with intelligence gathering and identifying those responsible, arresting them and dispersing them from the Hessle area by implementing conditions. Brough also continues to be on our radar with regards to anti-social driving. There will be static and hi viz patrols in marked vehicles throughout the summer holidays.



3. Welton Waters

Due to the recent spike in weather, there have been several logs relating to large gatherings of youths on the bank next to the water which is a public access. A few youths have taken it upon themselves to take boats from the sailing club. This has caused damage to some. Patrols will continue to show high visibility presence in the area during the holidays and deal appropriately with all those responsible.

Your local Neighbourhood Policing Team appreciates the importance of being in the right place, at the right time, for the right reasons to reassure the public, improve public confidence and reduce crime and anti-social behaviour in the area in which we all live and work.

We encourage all residents to call and report any issues where they live so that we can deal with any issues and step up our patrols in that area.

CRIME REDUCTION

Keeping your shed or garage safe and secure!

Many people don't secure their shed or garage in the same way they do their homes - often using an easy-to-break lock or padlock to protect valuable contents such as a car, bike or lawnmower.

An opportunistic burglar will try a shed or garage first because they can find the tools they need to break into the main house.

Shed and outbuilding security: first steps









Think like a thief!

Look at your shed and consider how you would break in. It's worth having a good padlock on the door with no exposed screws. Pay attention to hinges, as these are sometimes easily removable. If you have windows, then these could be vulnerable unless they're secured with wire mesh or grills. And keep it always locked.

Alarm it.

Consider a battery-operated shed alarm. They look low key, but they respond to movement or door contact with an extremely loud siren.

Lock it, hide it or mark it.

Don't give them the opportunity or the tools to commit a crime. Lock everything away securely. Tools can be locked inside a locker or box or secured with a chain.

Secure your bike to the ground or a lockable stand within a locked shed or garage. Visit <u>Sold Secure</u> to search for ground anchors and other locks designed to fix to floors and walls.



It's always worth draping an old sheet or blanket over the top of mowers or bikes to keep them covered from view.

Although it might sound like stating the obvious, never leave your garage or shed door unlocked if you're not around. Keep the door closed between uses so that no one can see what's inside.

Property mark your items and take photographs of them. Some tools can be painted with your name or postcode and forensic marking is also an option. You can also register any item that has a serial number with Immobilise.

A locksmith belonging to the <u>Master Locksmiths Association</u> can advise you on the most secure shed and garage door security. They can also help you install it. Most also provide full home security surveys.

Report Anti-Social Behaviour

Antisocial behaviour takes many forms, from aggressive, noisy or abusive behaviour to neighbourhood disturbances involving drugs, abandoned cars or animals.
